Moscow, February 6.

ON Thursday last the Empress arrived at a House belonging to the Prince of Georgia about Six Miles from hence, and was joined there on Saturday by the Great Duke and Dutcheſs; and Yesterday, between Two and Three o'Clock, every Thing being prepared for the Ceremony, by lining the Streets with Troops, &c. the Empress, accompanied by their Imperial Highnesses, made her Publick Entry into this Capital. Her Majesty was preceded by the Vice-Chancellor, the Ladies of Honour, and the Great Officers of the Household, and escorted by the Body-Guards. Two Triumphal Arches (adorned with emblematical Representations of the numerous Victories gained in the late War, by Sea and Land) having been erected in the principal Street leading to the Cathedral in the Krimlin, her Majesty passed under them in her Way to that Church; and, after performing her Devotions there, she proceeded to the newly erected Palace, where the Three first Classes of the Nobility, and the Foreign Ministers, waited to receive her Majesty.

Her Imperial Majesty has been pleased to confer the Order of St. Alexander Newsky on Prince Galitzin, Brother to the Vice-Chancellor.
