Moleow, February 6. N Thurlday laft the Emprefs arrived at a Houfe belonging to the Prince of Georgia about Six Miles from hence, and was joined there on Saturday by the Great Duke and Dutchefs; and Yefterday, between Two and Three o'Clock, every Thing being prepared for the Ceremony, by lining the Streets with Troops, &c. the Emprefs, accompanied by their Imperial Highueffes, made her Publick Entry into this Capital: Her Majefty was preceded by the Vice-Chancellor, the Ladies of Honour, and the Great Officers of the Houfhold, and efcorted by the Body-Guards. Two Triumphal Arches (adorned with emblematical Reprefentations of the numerous Victories gained in the late War, by Sea and Land) having been erected in the principal Street leading to the Cathedral in the Krimlin, her Majefty paffed under them in her Way to that Church ; and, after performing her Devotions there, fhe proceeded to the newly erected Palace, where the Three firft Claffes of the Nobility, and the Foreign Miniflers, waited to receive her Majefty.

Her Imperial Majefty has been pleafed to confer the Order of St. Alexander Newfky on Prince Galitzin, Brother to the Vice-Chancellor.
