Westminster, March 24.

THIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers: The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion; and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act for defraying the Charge of the Pay and Cloathing of the Militia, in that Part of Great Britain called England, for One Year, beginning the Twenty-fifth Day of March, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-five.

An Act to continue for a further Time an Act made in the Eighth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act to continue and amend an Act made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act for Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from Ireland, for a limited Time; and for allowing the Importation of Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon, and Butter, from the British Dominions in America, for a limited Time; and for extending the Provisions of the said Acts to Potatoes, and all Kinds of Pulse.

An Act for amending and widening the Road leading from Yarmouth Bridge, through the Hamlet of South Town, otherwise Little Yarmouth, to Gorleston in the County of Suffolk.

And to Thirteen Private Bills.

met Browne, late Bishop thereof, to the Archbishoprick of Tuam.

The King has also been pleased to order Letters Patent to be issued and passed under the Great Seal of the Kingdom of Ireland, for the Translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Dr. William Newcome, Bishop of Dromore, to the Bishoprick of Ossory in the said Kingdom, void by the Translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Dr. Charles Dodgson, late Bishop thereof, to the Bishoprick of Elphin.

The King has also been pleased to order Letters Patent to be issued and passed under the Great Seal of the Kingdom of Ireland, for the Promotion of James Hawkins, Doctor in Divinity, and Dean of Emly, to the Bishoprick of Dromore in the said Kingdom, void by the Translation of the Right Reverend Father in God Dr. William Newcome, late Bishop thereof, to the Bishoprick of Ossory.

St. James's, March 25.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint John Cookson, John Soley, Richard Capper, William Moreton Pleydell, and Jacob Reynardson, Esqrs. to be His Majesty's Commissioners for licensing Hackney Coaches and Chairs within the Cities of London and Westminster, and Suburbs thereof; and for putting the several Acts of Parliament in Execution relating thereto.
