

Vienna, March 25. The Archduke Maximilian arrived here Yesterday from Munich in perfect Health.

Hamburg, March 28. The Senate, for the same Reasons which induced them last Year to permit the Importation of Herrings, without adhering to the Mode which had subsisted to that Time, have thought proper to allow these Fish to be imported also this Year, without any Certificate or Oath being required as to the Time when the Herrings were caught.
