that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer - His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy-Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever (except the Mafter-General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid 19th Day of this Inflant April, pre-Tume to transport, into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaltwife, any Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip or lade any Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy-Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuf-tening the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, " An Act to " impower His Majelly to prohibit the Exportation " of Salt-petre; and to inforce the law for im-" powering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation 66 of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Am-" munition; and also to impower His Majesty to "" restrain the carrying Coastwife of Salt-petre, "Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-" nition." And the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Matter-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may rifpectively appertain.
