

Moscow, May 8. N. S. An Account has been received of the Arrival of the Turkish Ambassador at Chotzim, which is much sooner than was expected, and Prince Reprin set out from hence early Yesterday Morning.

The Celebration of the Peace is fixed for the 21st of July N. S. for which great Preparations are making.

Her Imperial Majesty has been graciously pleased to lower the Price of Salt five Copecks a Pood, which makes a Diminution in the Revenue of between three and four hundred thousand Roubles.

By an Ukase, which her Imperial Majesty has just issued, the Number of Horses, with which each Rank of Persons may drive, is fixed, under the Penalty of paying a Fine.

Dresden, May 22. On the 12th of this Month died at Langensaltz her Most Serene Highness the Dutchess Dowager of Saxe-Weissenfels.

Vienna, May 27. Our last Letters from Italy mention the Emperor's safe Arrival at Trieste, from whence he set out for Venice on the 19th Instant in perfect Health. The Time of his Imperial Majesty's Return to this Capital is not yet fixed; but it will hardly take Place before the Middle of July, as the Emperor intends to visit the Court of Florence, where he will probably spend a Month or six Weeks.
