The Imperial Commission here is providing a great hymber of Shoes, Stockens, Hats, Coats, & c. for the fervice of the Imperial Troops against they come into the Field again. Cologne, Dec. 29. Yefterday Count Kinsky the Impezial Ambaffador parted hence by the way of Dufeldorp, where he lodged the laft night, for Nimeguen, where his prefence is much wanted, in order to the carrying on the great work of the Peace ; for the Ambaffacors of all the principal parties except the Emperor, have been for fome time upon the place, and are hindred through the absence of the Imperial Ambassadors from making that progrefs in the Treaty, which it's hoped they will upon his arrival. The Sieur Straetman, who is the Emperors third Ambaffador, having affilted at the celebration of the Emperors marriage the 14 initiant at Rassaw, is likewise coming down, being commanded to repair forthwith to Nimeguen. From Wefiphalia they write, that the fix Brandenburg Regiments who defigned to have taken their Winter quarters in Hi defeim and this Diocefs, are marching back, in order to the taking them in the Territories of the Duke of Hanoger, &c.

Hague, Jan. 2. The Soldiers that are in Garifon here commit feveral outrages, and fome have of late practiled a way of extorting Money from the moft confiderable Inhabitants, by fending a Note to them, requiring them to leave fuch Sums of Money at certain places they appoint, and letting them know, that if they fail, they must expect to be pitcolled the next time they ftir abroad; and two nights fince an eminene Burgher having received fuch a Summons, carried the' Sum demandeo, and left it in a Church-yard according as he was appointed; but having first acquainted the Magistrates with it, they ordered their Officers co wait in fome convenient place, to observe who came and fetche the f.id Moneys; which they performed to well, that they frized a Sergeant and two Soldiers; who have fuff. rea the Tarture to discover their Accomplices and will receive condigne punifhment.

Paris, Jan. 3. The Deputy of the Elector of Bavariant this Court continues to negotiate feveral mat-1 ters of importance, and especially that of the marriage of the Dauphin with the Princels of Bivaria, which many are of opinion will be brought to a fuddain conclution. We are teld that his Majefly, at the inftance of the Pope, has conferred that his Ambaffador at Rome may ville the Cardinals of the last Promotion, which his Majefty has not hitherto permitted, becaufe of the oiffatisfaction he had against the Cardinal Aliert, who was Cardinal Pacron during the last Pontificate. The Mareschal Crequi is arrived at Court, where frequent Counfels are held for the regulating the operations of the next Campagne, which will be begun very early, especially in Flanders; from whence we hear that all the confiderable Spanish places in the Province of Haj-nault are blocked by our Troops, and so streightned by that means, that they will have difficulty to fublil this winter Weahaye Levers from the Northern parts, which speak of a Victory lately obtained by the Suedes against the Danes in Sch nen; of which we have not as yet the certain particulars, though in the mean time it is faid that the Suedes have relieved Malmoo, which place had been blocked up by the Danes, and was teduced to great extremity for want of Provisions. Oan affairs in Sicily go ftill on prosperously ; and we expect our next Lotters will bring us the certainty that Cetanea is beli ged.
