That thefe deluded People still perfist in their rebellious Opposition to the Confficutional Authority of these Realms, must be imputed to the unwarrantable and ciminal Intentions of those who have usurped the Rights of Sovereignty amongst them; Intentions, which the most vigorous Exertions may be required to defeat.

To your Miefly, and the only rightful Legislative Body of these Dominions, we chearfully confide the arduous Task of restoring Order and Tranquillity, by every Means which brave and loyal Subjects can put into your Hands; and we implore the Divine Affisance
