in the Morning. " The General, finding his Cannon too light to " effect a Breach, and that the Enemy would not " hearken to Terms of Capitulation, formed a De-" fign of carrying the Town by Escalade. In "this he was encouraged by the Extensiveness of the Works, and the Weakness of the Garrison. "When every Thing was prepared, while he was "waiting the Opportunity of a Snow Storm to "carry his Defign into Execution, feveral Men "deferted to the Enemy. His Plan at first was to the attracted the Linear and Lower Town at the " have attacked the Upper and Lower Town at the " fame Time, depending principally for Succels against the Upper Town : But discovering, from the Motions of the Enemy, that they were ap-" prized of his Defign, he altered his Plan; and, " having divided his little Army into Four Detach-" ments, ordered Two Feints to be made against the Upper Town, one by Colonel Livingston, at the Head of the Canadians, against St. John's Gate, the other by Captain Brown, at the Head of a fmall Detachment, against Cape Diamond, referving to himfelf and Colonel Arnold the two 65

principal Attacks against the Lower Town. "At Five o'Clock, the Hour appointed for the Attack, the General, at the Head of the New " York Troops, advanced against the Lower Town at Aunce de Mere. Being obliged to take a Cir-" cuit, the Signal for the Attack was given, and the Garrifon alarmed before he reached the Place; " " however, preffing on, he passed the first Barrier, and was just opening to attempt the Second, when by the first Fire from the Enemy he was " ... "unfortunately killed, together with his Aid de "Camp, Captain John M'Pherfon, Captain Cheefe-"man, and two or three more. This fo difpirited "the Men, that Colonel Campbell; on whom the Command devolved, found himself under the "

difagreeable Neceffity of drawing them off. "In the mean while Colonel Arnold, at the " Head of about 350 of those brave Troops (who with unparalleled Fatigue had penetrated Canada under his Command) and Captain Lamb's Com-" pany of Artillery, had paffed through St. Roques, and approached near a Two Gun Battery without being difcovered. This he attacked, and, though " " " it was well defended for about an Hour, carried it with the Lofs of a Number of Men. In this At-" tack Colonel Arnold had the Misfortune to have " " his Leg splintered by a Shot, and was obliged to " be carried to the Hospital. After gaining the Bat-" tery, his Detachment passed on to a second Barrier,

which they took Poffession of. By this Time the Enemy, relieved from the other Attacks, by our Troops being drawn off, directed their whole Force against this Detachment, and a Party fal-lying out from Palace Gate, attacked them in the Rear.

" These brave Men fusisined the Force of the whole Garrison for three Hours ; but finding them-" felves hemmed in, and no Hopes of Relief, they "were obliged to yield to Numbers, and the advantageous Situation the Garrifon had over them.

"No regular Return is yet come to Hand, but, by the Advices received, we learn, that our Lofs " in killed and wounded amounts to about 60, and 300 taken Prifoners, who are treated very hu-" manely.

" Among the flain, are Captain Kendricks and Lieutenant Humphries of the Riflemen, and Lieutenant Cooper.

After ihis unfortunate Repulse, the Remainder " of the Army retired about three Miles from the " City, where they have posted themselves advantageoufly, and are continuing the Blockade, waiting " for Reinforcements, which are now on their March " to join them.
