Surry and Suffex Turnpikes.

A General Quarterly Meeting of the Trustees for Repairing and Amending the Turnpike Roads in the Counties of Surry and Suffex is appointed to be held at the George Inn, in Croydon, on Saturday the 17th of August, 1776, at Eleven of the Clock in the Forenoon, to choose Trustees in the Room of those who are dead, removed, or refuse to act; and upon other Affairs relating to the Trust.
