Plantations or Dominions, in order to their being cancelled ; and that they do furnish themselves with Paffes of a new Form, under the Hands and Seals of Our Commissioners for Executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, in lieu thereof, for their feveral Ships and Veffels, according to the Treaty fubfitting between Us and the faid Governments on the Coafts of Barbary, and the Regulations made by Our Royal Predeceffor King George the First, by Order in His Privy Council, on the Fourteenth Day of June, in the Year One thousand feven hundred and twenty-two, so far as the fame remain unaltered by the Regulations this Day made by Us in Our Council, and according to the further Regulations then there made, and Our Instructions given to Our faid Commissioners for ex-ecuting the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland touching the fame. And whereas many Ships and Veffels belonging to Our loving Subjects continue feveral Years trading from Port to Port in the Mediterranean without returning Home, whereby they cannot fo conveniently procure their Paffes to be exchanged; We do hereby, for the Eafe of Our trading Subjects, publish and declare Our Plealure, That upon the Application of any Owner of any Ship or Veffel, or other fubitantial Merchant, to the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain, and Oath made by him of the Property of fuch Ship or Veffel, and that I hree fourths of the Company are Our Subjects, according to an Act, made in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of Our Royal Predeceffor King Charles the Second, (intituled, An Act for incouraging and increasing of Shipping and Navigation) and upon entering into a Bond for the Return of fuch Pals at the End of Three Years, or of the Voyage, if that shall foo er determine, it shall and may be lawful for Our Commillioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, or Our High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, for the fime being, and they are respectively impowere to make out a new Pais for fuch Ship or Veffel, and fend the fame to fuch of Our Confuls in the Medicerranean, as the faid Owner or Merchant shall defire, with Direction to fuch Conful, that, upon Application to him from the Master of the Ship, for which the Pass is made out, and furrendering up his old Pais, and entering into a like Bond for the Return of fuch new Pais, he shall deliver out the faid new Pafs to fuch Master, and transmit the old one, with the Bond, to the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain. And in order more effectually to hinder, for the future, any Abuses that may be attempted by Foreigners, relating to the new Paffes to be iffued as aforefaid, We do hereby surther declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, That all such new Paffes, to be hereafter iffued for any Ships or Veffels whatfoever belonging to any of Our Subjects of the Island of Minorca or Gibraltar, shall be made out in a peculiar Form, different from the Form of the new Passes to be if fued for Ships and Vessels belonging to any other Part of Our Dominions; and that such new Paffes shall be lodged with the respective Governors, Lieutenant Governors, or Commanders in Chief for the Time being, of the faid Island of Minorca and Gibraltar, and iffued out only by them, according to the Regulations made by Our faid Royal Predecef-for King George the First, and Ourself, in Council, as aforefaid : And the faid respective Governors, Lieutenant Governors, and Commanders in Chief, are hereby charged and required not to iffue or deliver out any fuch Paffes to any Perfons whatfoever, other than fuch as are really Our Subjects inhabiting in the faid Island of Minorca or Gibraltar respectively, and firifly to conform themfelves to the Regulations and Instructions made and given as aforefaid. But in regard it fometimes happens, that Ships, belonging to Our Subjects of other Parts of our Dominions, call in at Gibraltar and Minorca without Passes, and have Occasion to be furnished therewith; We do, for the further Conveniency of Trade, hereby publish and declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That it shall and may be lawful for Our Commissioners for excuting the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, or Our High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland for the Time being, and they are respectively hereby impowered, to lodge

Mediterranean Palles, of the fame Form with the new Paffes for Ships and Veffels belonging to any other Part of Our Dominions, in the Hands of Cur Governors, Lieutenant Governors, or Commanders in Chief, of Minorca and Gibraltar, with Directions to them to iffue and deliver out fuch Paffes to any of Our Subjects, not being Inhabitants of the faid Island of Minorea, or of Gibraltar, provided the Perfon or Perfons applying for the fame do comply with and conform to the feveral Rules and Regulations now in Ufe, and required to be observed by fuch Our other Subjects. And We do hereby order, That the Commissioners of Our Customs in Great Britain, and the Commissioners of Our Revenue in Ireland, do caufe to be carried into Execution fuch-Parts of the faid Order of Council of the Fourteenth Day of June, One thousand seven hundred and twenty-two, concerning Paffes, as relate to them-felves, and the proper Officers under them, fo far as the fame remains now in Force, and of Our Or-der aforefaid, made this Day in Council; and that they do direct their Officers in the feveral Ports of Our Kingdoms of Great Britain and Ireland, to demand of the Masters of all Merchant Ships, fo foor as they shall return into Port from a ForeignVoyage, all Paffes granted as aforefaid, which shall be in their Possession, to be produced to the faid respective Officers of Our Cultoms ; and that if the fame shall appear to be of an older Date than Twelve Months for Ships and Veffels trading on this Side the Streights Mouth, or for Ships and Veffels tiading to a greater Diffance, in Cafe the Voyages of fuch last-mentioned Ships and Vessels shall be determined, then fuch Paffes shall be delivered up to the faid respective Officers of Our Customs, and be by them returned to the Office of the Admiralty of Great Britain : And in Cafe the Master of any fuch Ship or Veffel shall refuse to produce or deliver up fuch Passes, according to the true Intent of Our faid Order, then the faid Officers shall certify the Name of every such Matter, and of the Ship or Veffel, to Our Commissioners for Executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, or to Our High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland for the Time being, to the End that Directions may be given for putting the Bond, entered into on the granting any fuch Pafs, in Suit : And all Our Governors, Lieutenant Governors, and C mmanders in Chief of any of Our Islands, Colonies, or Plantations, Confuls refiding in Foreign Parts, and all other Our Officers and Ministers whatsoever, and all other Our loving Subjects whom it may concern, are hereby expressly required and commanded to yield due Obedience unto, and firifily to obferve, all the Orders, Infructions, Regnations, and Directions before mentioned, on Pain of Our High Difpleafure.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the 28th Day of August, One thousand feven hundred and feventy fix, in the Sixteenth Year of Our Reign.

WHereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That on Monday the 12th of August last, a Trus of upwards of Six: y Yards of Flannel, packed up in a coarje Wrapper about Two Feet Eight Inches long. cord d with a thick Cord, and fent by Mr. William Adams, (an Exchanger of the light Gold Coin under Government) by the Ludicaw and Leominster Fly, di-rected to Mr. A. Bennett and Co. N° 72, Aldermanbury, London, was (between the Confignment of the faid Truss to the Coach at Ludlow, and the Delivery thereof at Mr. Bennett's in Aldermanhury) opened and robbed of One Thousand exchangeable Guineas, and about Forty Ounces of Moidores, Ports, and light Gold: His Majefty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the said Robbery, or in the unpacking, opening, altering, or remo-ving the faid Truss, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall difcover bis or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, Jo that be, she, or they may be apprehended and convisied thereof.
