A PROCLAMATION.
GEORGE R.
WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Fifteenth Day of October next; We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Fifteenth Day of October next to Thursday the Thirty first Day of the said Month of October; and We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly: And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Thirty-first Day of October next, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Thirty-first Day of October next.

Given at Our Court at St. James's the Twentieth Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-six, in the Sixteenth Year of Our Reign.
