W Hereas it is requisite for the Public Safety, vent the Exportation of Provisions; It is therefore hereby ordered by His Majefty in Council, that an Embargo be forthwith laid upon all Ships and Veffels laden, or to be laden, in the Ports of Great Britain, with Black Cattle and Hogs, Beef, Pork, But-ter, and Cheefe, or any Sort of Provisions, except Fish, Corn, or Grain of any Kind, or Pulse, and that the faid Embargo do continue and remain upon fuch Ships and Veffels 'till further Order : But it is His Majefty's Pleafure that the faid Embargo shall not extend to any Ships or Veffels that shall be employed in Carrying Provifions to any of His Majefty's Weft India Islands, or to any of His Majefty's Colonies in North America (except the Colonies of New Hampshire, Massachusets Bay, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Penfilvania, The Three Lower Counties on Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia) or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa or the Island of Saint Helena; provided, that the Owners of fuch Ships or Veffels do make Oath, on the Entry of fuch Ships or Veffels, of the due Destination thereof to the Place to which fuch Ships or Veffels shall be for entered to clear out as aforefaid, and do give Security by Bond to the proper Officers of the Cuftoms of the Port at which fuch Ships or Veffels shall enter and clear out, with two other able and fufficient Securities, in treble the Value of the Cargo of fuch Provisions, for the Performance of the Conditions therein fpecified; and do thereby engage, that fuch Ships and Veffels shall proceed under Convoy of one of His Majefty's Ships, and fhall not defert the Convoy on their Voyage; and likewife to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of fuch Bond, from the proper Officer of the Cuftoms of the Port to which fuch Ships or Veffels shall go, Certificates of their having delivered their Cargoes at the Places for which they fhall have been entered; and no fuch Bonds or Securities shall be delivered up but on the Production of fuch Certificates. And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to order, that the faid Embargo fhall not extend to any Ship or Veffel actually retained or employed in His Majesty's Service, nor to any Ship or Veffel which shall be laden by the especial Order and under the Directions of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, or the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, with any Kind of Provisions for the Use of His Majesty's Fleets or Armies. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the neceffary Directions for carrying the fame into Execution, fo far as to them fhall refpectively apper-G. Chet-wynd. tain.

W Hereas His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the 26th of January last, to lay an Embargo upon all Ships and Vessels laden or to be laden in the Ports of the Kingdom of Ireland with Provisions of any Kind (ex -cept as therein excepted). And whereas His Ma-jefty was pleafed, by another Order in Council of the 14th of February following, to declare, That the faid Embargo fhould not extend to Corn

or Grain of any Kind : And whereas it hath been. represented, that the faid Embargo hath in many Instances been evaded - It is hereby ordered by His Majesty in Council, that an Embargo be forthwith laid upon all Ships and Veffels laden or to be laden in any of the Ports of the Kingdom of Ireland with Black Cattle and Hogs, Beef, Pork, Butter, and Cheefe, or any Sort of Provisions, except Fish, Corn, or Grain of any Kind, or Pulse; and that the faid Embargo do continue and remain upon fuch Ships and Veffels till further Order : But it is Majesty's Pleasure, that the said Embargo do not extend to Ships or Vessels bringing Cattle of any Kind, Salted Beef, Pork, Bacon and Butter from Ireland into this Kingdom, pursuant to the Liberty granted for that Purpose by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament; nor to any Ship or Vessel that shall be employed in carrying Pro-visions to any of His Majesty's West India Islands, or to any of His Majesty's Colonies in North America, (except the Colonies of New Hampfhire, Massachusets Bay, Rhode Island, Connecti-cut, New York, New Jersey, Pensylvania, The Three Lower Counties on Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia) or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena; provided that the Owners of fuch Ships and Veffels do make Oath, on the Entry of fuch Ships and Veffels, of the due Defination thereof to the Place for which fuch Ships and Veffels shall be fo entered to clear out as aforefaid, and do give Security by Bond to the proper Officers of the Cuftoms, at the Port at which fuch Ships and Veffels shall enter and clear out, with two other able and fufficient Securities, in treble the Value of the Cargo of fuch Provisions, for the Performance of the Conditions therein specified; and do thereby en-gage that such Ships and Vessels shall proceed under Convoy of one of His Majefty's Ships, and hall not defert their Convoy on their Voyage; and likewife to produce, within Twelve Months from the Date of fuch Bond, from the proper Officer of the Customs at the Port to which such Ships or Vessels shall go, Certificates of their having delivered their Cargoes at the Places for which they shall have been enrered; and no fuch Bonds or Securities shall be delivered up before the Production of such Certificates. And His Majesty is hereby further pleased to order, That the faid Embargo shall not extend to any Ship or Vessel actually retained or employed in His Majesty's Service, nor to any Ship or Vessel which shall be laden by the especial Order, and un-der the Directions, of the Lords Coumissioners of His Majefty's Treasury, or of the Lords Commisfioners of the Admiralty, with any Kind of Provi-fions for the Ufe of His Majesty's Fleets and Armies-And His Excellency Earl Harcourt, Lord Lieutenant of His Majefty's Kingdom of Ireland, is to give the neceffary Directions for caufing the faid Embargo to be firicily observed in that King-G. Chetwynd. dom.
