PROCLAMATION, А For Recalling and Probibiting Seamen from ferving Foreign Princes and States; and for granting Rewards for difcovering fuch Seamen as shall conceal them selves.

HEREAS We are informed, That great Numbers of Mariners and Seafaring Men, Our natural-born Subjects, are in the Service of divers Foreign Princes and States, to the Prejudice of Our Kingdom; We have therefore thought it neceffary, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and do hereby strictly charge and command all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatfoever and wherefoever, (being Our natural-born Subjects) who are in the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or do ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel, that forthwith they, and every of them, do (according to their known and bounden Duty and Allegiance) withdraw themselves, depart from, and quit fuch Foreign Services, and return Home to their Native Countries. And farther, We do hereby strictly prohibit and forbid all Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, and other Seafaring Men whatfoever, (being Our Natural-born Subjects) from entering, and do charge and command them, and every of them, from henceforth, to forbear to enter themfelves into the Pay or Service of any Foreign Prince or State, or to ferve in any Foreign Ship or Veffel whatfoever, without Our Special Licence first had and obtained in that Behalf; to all which We expect due Obedience, and exact Conformity. And We do hereby publish and declare, That the Offenders to the Contrary shall not only incur Our just Displeasure, but be proceeded against for their Contempt according to the utmost Severities of the Law. And We do hereby declare, 12 at if any such Masters of Ships, Pilots, Mariners, Seamen, Shipwrights, or other Seafaring Men, (being Our Subjects) shall be taken in any Foreign Service by the Turks, Algerines, or any others, they shall not be reclaimed by Us as Sub-And We do hereby projects of Great Britain. mife and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, shall be paid any Person who Ihall difcover any Seaman or Seamen, who may fecrete themfelves, that fo fuch Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for Our faid Service by any of Our Sea-Officers employed for Raifing Men, on or before the Thirty-first Day of December next; the faid Rewards to be paid for any Seaman or Seamen fo difcovered and taken in and about London by the principal Officers and Commiffioners of Our Navy; and at the Out Ports by the Naval Officers (where there are any); and where there are no Naval Officers, by the Collectors of Our Cultoms, immediately upon a Certificate being produced to

the faid Principal Officers and Commissioners of Our Navy, Naval Officers, or Collectors refpectively, by the Perfon who may make Difcovery of any Seaman or Seamen as aforefaid, certifying his Name, and the Name or Names and Number of Seamen procured in confequence of his Difcovery ; the faid Certificate to be given by fuch Officer as may take fuch Seaman or Seamen for Our Service. Given at Our Court at St. James's the Eighth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-fix, ber, One thousand seven human eight. in the Seventeenth Year of Our Reign.
