Most gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects,
the Mayor Alderman Process. the Mayor, Aldermen, Burgesses, and principal Inhabitants of the Town of Stockton upon Tees in the County of Durham, humbly approach the Throne with the purest and liveliest Sentiments of the most respectful Congratulation upon the rapid Progress of Your Majesty's Arms in North

We have feen, Dread Sir, with an equal Degree of Astonishment and deep Concern, an inconsiderable Number of ambitious and defigning Men, grown averse from those necessary Restraints which can only make the Bleffings of Civil Liberty either valuable or lasting, daring to treat the kindest and best of Kings with Rudeness and Ingratitude; fcattering Madness and Rebellion through whole Provinces; and striving, (impotently enough) by a monfirous Confederacy, to subvert the true Interest and Constitution of their Mother Country

Amidst the Wreck of every valuable Enjoyment, following close upon intestine Factions, we have seen also, with increasing Wonder and Delight, your Royal Arm extended to stem the wasteful Torrent of Oppression, Penury, and Death; and thus greatly sacrificing the justest Resembness to Clemency and the Public Good.

The united Experience of many Years hath convinced us how tender your Majesty is over the Rights and Liberties of all your Subjects;— how excellently framed for the arduous Employ of governing a great and free People: And we are proud to assure your Majesty, that a grateful Sense of these general Blessings is so sirmly interwoven with our Loyalty and Affection, that we would as soon confound the Distinctions of Heaven and Earth, as weaken or dissolve such an Union.

May the universal Eye of Providence continue to guide your Majesty's Counsels, and favour your

generous Sollicitude to restore Peace and Order among your Majefly's feditious and diffracted Colonies. May Liberty and Religion ever confide in Britain as their Bulwark, and contend in bleffing our Gracious King: So shall the present Age venerate His unrivaled Greatness, and Posterity justify and emulate their Veneration.
