Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife, except in the Cases com prized within the aforementioned Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September 1ast, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inslicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An "Act to impower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law
for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the
Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of
Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition." — And the Lords Commifsioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively apportain.
