Brussels, April 18.

AN Ordinance has been published here, for prolonging, during the Term of One Year, the Ordinance of the 27th of April, 1776, prohibiting the Supplying the British Colonies in America with Warlike Stores; of which the following is a Translation:

MARIA Therefa, &c. &c. To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting. By Our Ordinance of the 27th of April of last Year, We forbid, during the Term of One Year, all Our Subjects to furnish, directly or indirectly, by their own Ships or by Foreign Ships, any Succour to the Americans, Subjects of Great Britain, in Artillery, Arms, Powder, Flints, or other Ammunition, Implements, or Instruments of War, under the Penalties provided by the same Ordinance; and as the Term prescribed for that Prohibition will expire on the 27th of the present Month; We, with the View of giving to Our Most dearly beloved Brother The King of Great Britain a new Proof of Our Friendship, and of the Interest We take in the Good of His Service, have, by the Advice of Our Most dear and faithful the Chief and President, and others of Our Privy Council, and on consulting with Our Most dearly beloved Brother-in-Law and Cousin, Charles Alexander, Duke of Lorraine and Bar, Grand Master of the Teutonic Order, Our Lieutenant, Governor and Captain General of the Low Countries, prolonged, as We do hereby prolong, for the further Term of One Year, the Effect of Our said Ordinance of the 27th of April, 1776, which shall, in Consequence, continue in Force in all it's Points and Articles, until the 27th of April, 1778.

We therefore command Our most dear and faithful the Chief and Presidents, and others of Our Privy and Great Councils, the President and others of Our Council of Flanders, and to all other Our Judges, Officers and Subjects whom it may concern, that they fail not to publish, observe and maintain Our present Ordinance, according to it's Form and Tenor, stopping, and putting a Stop to all Obstacles and Impediments to the contrary. For such is Our Pleasure. In Witness whereof We have caused Our Great Seal to be affixed to these Presents. Given in Our City of Brussels the 17th Day of April, 1777, in the 37th Year of Our Reign, &c.
