*Warsaw, April 19.*

**T**HE Decease of the Prince Primate of Poland at Marseilles having been notified to his Majesty by the Magistrates of that City, the King Yesterday nominated the Bishop of Cujavia, Oltrowski, to that important Post.

*Vienna, April 23.* The Empress and the Arch-dutchefs removed from hence to Schonbrunn on Friday last.

The Archduke Maximilian is gone to Hungary, in order to view the Fortresses of that Kingdom.

The Town of Cremnitz, where the Mint of the Hungarian Gold Mines is established, has been unfortunately burnt to the Ground.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the 25th Day of October last, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the Thirty-first of December then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board such Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was likewise pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Eighth Day of November last, to promise and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid, in the Manner thereby directed, to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might secrete themselves, that so such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Service by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the said Thirty-first Day of December: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to this Thirtieth Day of April; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the said Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer: His Majesty, with the Advice of His

Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, That the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from this Thirtieth Day of April to the Thirtieth Day of June next inclusive. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
