The King's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS His Majely was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the 25th Day of October laft, to promife and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who fhould, on or before the Thirty first of December then following, enter themselves to serve in riis Majesty's Royal avy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was like-wife pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Eighth Day of Piovember laft, to pro-mife and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Or-dinary Seaman, fnould be paid, in the Manner thereby directed, to any Perfon who fhould difcover ary Seaman or Seamon who might fecrete themfelves, that fo fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Wajesty's faid Service by any of His Majesty's SLa Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of December: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to this Thirtieth Day of April; and it being judged expedient for His Ma etty's Service, that the faid Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer: His Majesty, with the Advice of His
