Berlin, June 19.
HIS Prussian Majesty returned to Potsdam on Saturday last from the Reviews in Pomerania and Prussia.

Stockholm, June 20. According to Letters from Helsingfors, his Swedish Majesty arrived there on the 10th Instant in the Morning, after a very short Passage, and went immediately on Shore to review the Regiment of Nyland, Infantry, which was encamped near that Place. In the Evening his Majesty embarked on board the Galley, Seraphim, and proceeded on his Voyage to Petersburg.

Vienna, June 21. The Archduke Maximilian returned two Days ago in perfect Health from his Tour round the Fortresses on the Frontiers of Hungary.

Dresden, June 22. Last Tuesday his Serene Highness Prince George of Mecklenburg arrived here in good Health from Hanover, and on Wednesday Morning proceeded on his Journey to Vienna.
