*The Queen's Palace, St. James's Park,
November 4.*

LAST Night, about Nine o'Clock, the Queen was happily delivered of a Princess. His Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury, several Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, and the Ladies of Her Majesty's Bed-Chamber, were present.

This great Event was soon after made known by the Firing of the Tower Guns.

Her Majesty is, God be praised, as well as can be expected; and the young Princess is in perfect Health.

Petersburg, October 3 Wednesday last, being the Great Duke's Birth-day, the Foreign Ministers had the Honour of paying their Compliments to the Empress and their Imperial Highnesses in the Morning; and in the Evening there was a Ball at Court.

This Day, being the Anniversary of the Empress's Coronation, there was a very numerous Court in the Morning; and this Evening there will be a Ball at Court.

The Promotions made, and Dignities conferred on this Occasion, are as follow:

To the Princess Orlow, the Order of St. Catherine.
To General Baur, the Order of St. Alexander Newsky.

Prince Galitzin, Major of the Guards, and Mess. Nepleuff and Samoilow, First Procurators of the Senate, are made Senators and Privy Counsellors.

Monf. Engelhardt, Governor of Wibourg, is advanced to the Rank of Lieutenant-General.

Monf. Soritz is made Major-General and Cornet of the Chevalier Guards.

Monf. Apraxin, Lieutenant of the Guards, is made Gentilhomme de la Chambre.

Vienna, October 15. This being the Feast of St. Theresa, his Imperial Majesty dined in Publick with the Knights of that Military Order.

Count Colorado, Dean of the Chapter of Olmutz has been elected Archbishop of that See, in the room of the late Count Hamilton.

Vienna, October 22. The Empress and the whole Court returned to Town Yesterday for the Winter Season; and the Archduke and Archduchess are expected from Milan on Tuesday next.

Dublin, October 25, 1777.

Thursday last, being the Anniversary of the Irish Rebellion in 1641, his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant proceeded in State to Christ Church, attended by the House of Peers, Judges, &c. and escorted by a Squadron of Horse; where a most excellent Sermon was preached by the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Down, upon that Occasion. The Sword of State was carried to and from the Church by the Earl of Miltown. After his Excellency's Return to the Castle the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square in the Barracks: And at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Rejoicings, throughout the City.
