15th Day of August last, for prohibidom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Salt-petre, or any Sort of Aims or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this instant November: whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, except in those Cases where (for the Benesit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Use and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Paits, and of the Transports and Victualling Vessels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His several Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of Octobe 12st, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Redrictions mentioned in certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the said Orders: His Majesty doth ther fore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, here-by order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whomsoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Ser-vice) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the said 23d Day of this instant November, presume to transport into this inflant November, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coast-wise, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gun-powder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Am-munition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the fame beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwise, except in the Cases comprized within the aforementioned Orders prized within the afforementioned Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 12th of February, the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October 1ast, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Priva Council, when Pain of incurring and Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and senalties instituted by an Ast passed in the 29th Year of His late Majesty's Reign, entituled, "An Ast to impower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms and Ammunition; and also to impower His Majesty to restrain the carrying Coastwife His Majefty to refrain the carrying Coasswife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition."—And the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treassury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Administration of Coast Pairs in the Lord Words of the miral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Matter-General of the Ordnance, and His Majedy's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively, appertain.
