The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Reval Proclamation bearing pleased. by His Reyal Proclamation bearing Date the 25th of October 1776, to promise and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who should, on or before the 31st of December then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships. or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as should be employed for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy. And whereas His Majesty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the 8th Day of November, 1776, to promife and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen, who might fecrete themselves, that so such and or Seaman or Seaman or Seaman fhould be taken for His Majesty's said Service, b, any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for raining Men, on or before the said 31st Day of December. And whereas His Majesty was likewise pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the 15th Day of August last, to promise and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Theory Wars who should reductive enter him. of Twenty Years, who should voluntarily enter him-felf to serve on Board any of His Majesty's Ships, on or before the 31st Day of October then next, should receive as of His Majesty's Reval Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed. And whereas the And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 31st Day of this Instant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bouncies and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His

Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be procuaged and extended from the &d 31st Day of this smant December, to the 28th Day of February, 1778, inclusive.— Whereof al. Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

That Will am Yeal, James McClellar, William Rumford, and Martin Siepherd, Officers of the Cuftems at Hartlepoole in the Port of Stockton, bewing, about Eleven c'Clock in the Nig't of the 14th of laj. Mich, feized on the Sea Coast near that Port, from Three Min belonging to a Smuggling Vessel, Taventy-five Bags of Tea and Three Bags of Cosse Berries, which tree conveyed to the Custom House at Hartlepoole aforesaid, and there continued guarding the same till about Twelve o'Clock at Night, when it was surrounded by Fisteen or Sixteen Men belonging to the said Smuggling Vessel, armed with Blunderbusses, Pistols, and other effensive Weapons, several of which they discharged through the Windows and Door of the said Custom-thouse, and esterwards felonicusly broke and entered the same, when the Officers were obliged, for the Pieservanion of their Liwes, to retreat into the Warehouses above Stairs; that they afterwards fixed through the Ciling into the Warehouse where the Officers had retired to, and thereby put their Liwes in the utmost Hazard; that they then broke open the Warehouse Door, presented a Blunderbus to the Breast of the said James McClellan, and threatened to destroy him and the rest of the Officers, if they made the least Resistance; and by Force and Violence rescued and carried away the said Tea and Cossee, so siezed by the said Officers, and lodged for safe Custody in the faid Custom-House:

His Majefty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in breaking open the said Custom-House, and rescuing and carrying away the said Goods, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of the said Offenders, who shall discover his Accomplices, so that Two or more of them may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
