Petersburg, December 9.

ON Sunday last, being St. George's Day, the Knights of that Order had the Honour of dining with her Imperial Majesty as usual. One Knight of the fourth Class was created, and one advanced from the fourth to the third Class. There was a Court in the Morning, and a Ball in the Evening. The same Day the Empress invested M. Soritz with the Polish Order of the White Eagle.

Turin, December 17. On Monday last the Royal Family returned from Montcalier, in order to pass their Winter Residence in this Capital. His Sardinian Majesty has promoted Count della Marmora, late Viceroy of Sardinia, to the vacant Post of Grand Master of the Household.
