Royal Hospital for Seamen at Greenwich, February 3, 1778.

THE Commissioners and Governors of this Hospital do hereby give Notice, That on Wednesday the 5th Day of August next, or as soon after as may be, will be let on Leases, to commence upon the 12th Day of May, 1779, All those several Farms of Land, Tythes, Collieries, Corn-Mills, Lime-Kilns, and other Estates within the several Baronies, Manors, Lordships, Townships, Hamlets or Villages hereafter-mentioned, viz. Dilston, Thornbrough, and Corbridge Farms will be let on Lease for Six Years; Newlands and Whittonsfall, Wooley, Hexhamshire, Heckford, Langhope, Coastley, Highwood and Westwood Farms, for Nine Years; Harpendale, Sillywray, Plankey Pasture, Vance and Loaning Foot, the Lough, Middle Dean Raw, East Dean Raw, the Lees, Tedcastle, Land Ends West Farm, and Fourstones Farms, (Part of the Barony of Langley) for Six Years; Low Close, and Strother Close, Peelwell and Whitfield's Tenement, and Water Wells Close, Part of Lipwoodwell Farm, (also Part of Langley Barony) for Three Years; the other Farms in the Barony of Langley, for Twelve Years; Ellington and Woodhall Farms, and Woodhall Mill, and Ground, (in the Barony of Wark) for Six Years; Buteland, for Six Years; Whittles and Lee-houses, Hartburn Grange, Needles Hall, and Meldon, for Nine Years; and the remaining Farms, &c. will be let on Lease for Twenty one Years or under.
