**Nottinghamshire Militia.**

Whereas several Advertisements have appeared under my Name, signifying, that the Time of raising the present Regiment of Militia for the County of Nottingham will expire on the Second Tuesday of May instant; and whereas upon due Consideration of the several Acts of Parliament relating to the Militia, it is found, that the Term, for which the present Militia are engaged to serve, will not expire until the Months of August, September and October next, being three Years from the Time that they were respectively raised, sworn in, and enrolled.

I do therefore desire the Deputy Lieutenants, Justices of the Peace, and Gentlemen of the County, to meet according to my former Advertisement, at the County Hall of Nottingham, on Tuesday the 12th Day of this instant May, to fill up the Vacancies in the said Regiment, and to order Subdivision Meetings within the several Parts of the County in which they reside, for the further putting the Militia Laws into Execution.

**S U S S E X.**

Whereas, by an Act passed in the Second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to explain, amend, and reduce into One Act of Parliament, the several Laws now in being, relating to the Raising and Training the Militia within that Part of Great Britain called England," it is enacted, That in all Counties where the Militia has not been raised, His Majesty's Lieutenant for every such County,

together with any Two or more Deputy Lieutenants, and, on the Death or Removal or in the Absence of His Majesty's Lieutenant, any Three or more Deputy Lieutenants shall meet at some City or Principal Town of the County for which they shall be commissioned, on the Second Tuesday in May in every Year; I do hereby give Notice, That the said Meeting will be held for the County of Suffex, at the Town Hall at Lewes, on Tuesday next the 12th Instant, at Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon. for the Purposes in the said Act directed to be pursued at the said First General Meeting towards raising the Militia.

ON Saturday last the 4th Instant, about Eleven at Night, the Post Boy was attacked and robbed, Eight Miles from York, in the Road to Malton, of the Bag of Letters from this Office of Thursday Night last the 2d Instant, for Scarborough, Malton, Whitby, and other Places within the Delivery of Scarborough and Malton, and also of the Bag with the Bye and Roaa Letters for the same Places.

The Person who committed this Robbery was then on Foot, but when he passed two Turnpike Gates in the Neighbourhood was mounted upon a Light Bay mettled Horse, about Fourteen Hands and an Half high, strong made; and the Bar-keepers agree with the Post-Boy in the Description of the Robber, that he was a stout Man, Six Feet high, and thin in the Face, with Black Stockings, Waistcoat and Breeches, and Brown Copper-coloured Coat; his own short curled Hair powdered, with a round Hat, two Sides of it tied up; and the Post-Boy observed, whilst he lay with his Hands and Feet bound in a Field adjoining the Road, that the Robber put the Bills, &c. which he took out of the Letters, into the inside Pocket of his light Great Coat.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the Person who committed this Robbery, will be intitled to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending Highwaymen; or if any Person, whether an Accomplice in the Robbery, or knowing thereof, shall make Discovery, whereby the Person who committed the same may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer will, upon Conviction of the Party, be intitled to the same Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, and will also receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon.
