HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Mesfage was fent to the Honourable House of Commons, by Robert Quarme, Esq; Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acequainting them that the Lords, authorized by Virzue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Asts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great-Britain, the Lord President of the Council, and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for raising a certain Sum of Money, by Loans or Exchequer Bills, for the Service of the Year

One thousand seven hundred and seventy-eight.

An Ast to repeal such Part of an Ast, made in the last Session of Parliament, as relates to the Manner of discharging Bonds given for the due Exportation of certain Goods from Great Britain to Foreign Parts; and to extend such Part of the same Act as obliges the Master of British or Irish Ships, sailing from any of His Mojesty's Dominions into the Baltic, to deliver a Manifest of their Cargoes to the British Consul residing there, to the like Vessels sailing into Denmark, Normand Achonnel way, and Archangel.

An Act to indemnify fuch Persons as have omitted to qualify themselves for Offices and Employments; and to indemnify Justices of the Peace, or others, who have omitted to register or deliver in their Qualifications within the Time limited by Law, and for giving further Time for those Purposes; and to indemnify Mimbers and Officers, in Cities, Corporations, and Borough Towns, whose Admissions have been omitted to be stamped according to Law, or, having been stamped, have been lost or missaid, and for allowing them Time to provide Admissions duly stamped; and to give further Time to fuch Persons as bave omitted to make and file Affidavits of the Execution of Indentures of Clerks to Attornies and Solicitors.

An Att to continue the several Laws therein-mentioned, relating to the Allowance upon the Exportation of British-made Gunpowder; to the further encou-raging the Manufacture of British Sail Cloth, and to the Duties payable on Foreign Sail Cloth; to the grant-. ing a Literty to carry Sugars, of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture, of any of His Majesty's Sugar Colonies, direally to Foreign Parts, in Ships built in Great Britain, and navigated according to Law; to the further Punishment of Persons going armed or disquised, in Desiance of the Laws of Customs or Excise; to the prohibiting the Importation of light Silver Coin of this Realm from Foreign Countries into Great Britain or Ireland, and to restrain the Tender thereof havand and Ireland, and to restrain the Tender thereof beyond a certain Sum; to the granting a Bounty upon Flax Seed imported into Ireland; to the better regulating of Pilots for the conducting of Ships and Vessels from Dower, Deal, and Isle of Thanet; and to review and continue so much of an Act, made in the Sixteenth Year of His present Mujesty's Reign, as relates to allowing the Expertation of certain Quantities of Wheat, and other Articles, to His Majesty's Sugar Colonies in America.

An Act for allowing further Time for Involvment of Deeds and Wills made by Papifts, and for Relief of Protestant Purchasers.

An Act to amend fuch Part of an Act, made in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of Queen Elizabeth, intituled, An AA for the Relief of the Poor, as relates to the binding of Parish Apprentices.

An AA to enable the Corporation of Trinity House of

Deptford Strond, to establish and maintain a Light House on the Rocks called The Smalls, in Saint George's Channel.

An Act for building a Bridge across the River Tawer, at a Place called The Wich Tree, in the Parish Llansamlett, to the apposite Shore, in the Parish of Llangevelach, in the County of Glamorgan; for making proper Avenues or Roads to and from the faid Bridge; and also for repairing and widening the Road from Pentre Brook, near a Place called Aberdwyberthy, in the Parish of Saint John's, near Swansea, to the said intended Bridge.

An Act for impowering the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons, of the City of London, in Common Council assembled, to raise upon the Credit of the Surplusse to arise out of a certain Fund, commonly called The Orphans Fund, the Sum of Forty Thousand Pounds, towards discharging the Debt incurred in rebuilding the Gaol of Newgate, and a Sessions House adjoining, and for compleating the said Goal, and building an Infirmary thereto, and other the Purposes therein mentioned.

An Act to repeal an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, for the Recovery of Small Debts, within the several Parishes of Surfleet, Gosperton, Quadring, Donnington, Bicker, Swinespead, Wigtost, Sutterton, Algarkirke, Fosdyke, Kirton, Frampton, Wiberton, and Brothertost, within the Hundred of Kirton, and County of Lincoln.

An Act for building a Stone Bridge across the River Tyne, opposite the Town of Hexham, in the County of Northumberland, and for making proper Roads and Avenues to and from the same.

An Att for repairing the Highways and Bridges, in

the County of Stirling.

An Ast to enable Hestor Munro, Esquire, to build and maintain a Harbour and Pier at the Town of Find-

and maintain a thereour and there as the lown of rina-born, in the County of Elgin and Forres.

An Act for paving the High Street, or Road, lead-ing from Aldersgate Bars, in the Parish of Saint Bo-tolph without Aldersgate, London, to the Turnpike near-the End of Goswell Street, in the County of Middless x and for applying the Sum of Five Thousand Pounds, to be raised upon the Credit of the Surplusses to arise out of a certain Fund, commonly called The Orphans Fund. for Such Purpose.

An All for empowering the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons, of the City of London, in Common Conneil ofsembled, to make a Street, or Opening, from Moor. fields, opposite Chiswell Streee, towards the East into Bishopsgate Street; and also from the East End of Chis-well Street Westward into Barbican; and to raise upon the Credit of the Surplusses to arise out of a certain Fund, commonly called The Orphans Fund, the Sum of Sixteen Thousand Five Hundred Pounds, for such Purpose.
