

Cheerly, in the County of Surrey, and to the South East Side of the Turnpike Road, in the Parish of Turgis, in the said County of Southampton.

An Act for better paving, cleansing, lighting, and watching, the Street and Lanes, within the Town of Dover, in the County of Kent, and in the several Parishes of Saint Mary the Virgin, and Saint James the Apostle, in the said Town and County; and for removing and preventing Nuisances and Annoyances therein.

An Act for paving and repairing the Streets, Lanes, and other public Passages and Places, within such Part of the Liberty of Norton Folgate, in the County of Middlesex, as is Extra-parochial, and certain Parts of M. g. p. e. Aley and Blossom Street, in the Parish of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, in the said County, and for removing Obstructions and Annoyance therein.

An Act to amend an Act, passed in the Twenty-sixth Year of King George the Second, more effectually to enable the Parishes of the Parish of Christ Church, in the County of Middlesex, to purchase, hire, or erect, a Workhouse for the employing and maintaining the Poor of the said Parish, and for the more effectual Support and Employment of the Poor therein.

An Act for applying the Sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Pounds, to arise out of the Surpluses of a certain Fund, commonly called The Orphans Fund, for the Purpose of widening certain Avenues leading into Goodmans Fields, in the County of Middlesex.

An Act for applying the Sum of Nine Thousand Pounds, to arise out of the Surpluses of a certain Fund, commonly called the Orphans Fund, for the Purpose of making a Passage for Carriages, from Spi. Fields to Bishopsgate Street, in the County of Middlesex.

An Act for applying the Sum of One Thousand Pounds, to arise out of the Surpluses of a certain Fund, commonly called the Orphans Fund, for the Purpose of opening Communications between Wapping Street and Ratcliff Highway and between Old Gravel Lane and Virginia Street, within the Parishes of Saint George and Saint John of Wapping, in the County of Middlesex.

An Act for applying the Sum of Four Thousand Pounds, to arise out of the Surpluses of a certain Fund, commonly called The Orphans Fund, towards completing the paving of the Town and Borough of Southwark, and certain Parts adjacent, in the County of Surrey.

An Act for paving, cleansing, lighting, and watching, the Town of Northampton; and for removing and preventing Incroachments, Obstructions, and Annoyances therein.

An Act for authorizing the Justices of the Peace for the County of Middlesex to sell the present Session House for the said County, and for enabling them to build another Session House in a more convenient Situation, and to keep the same in Repair; and for applying the Sum of Eleven Thousand Pounds, (to be borrowed upon the Credit of the Surpluses of a certain Fund, commonly called The Orphans Fund) towards defraying the Expence of building the said Session House.

An Act for repealing an Act made in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, For repairing and widening the Road, leading from a Part of the Road (directed to be repaired by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, from Carlisle to Newcastle upon Tyne) near Glenwhelk, to another Part of the Road (so making from Carlisle to Newcastle) upon Shildon Common, in the County of Cumberland; and for making more effectual Provision for the Repair of the said Road.

An Act for altering, repairing, and widening, the Road from Summer Road Bar, near the Town of Hexham, in the County of Northumberland, to the Town of Alston, in the County of Cumberland.

An Act to empower the Trustees for amending the Road from Uttoxeter to Newcastle under Lyne, in the County of Stafford, to repair and widen the Road branching out of the said Road at Lower Lane, to the Turnpike Road on Hem Heath, in the same County.

An Act for continuing and amending an Act made in the Twenty-sixth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, for repairing the Road leading from the Town of Penrith, in the County of Cumberland, by Hutton Hall, over Skelton and Castle Sorwerby Pastures, and Sebra-

ham Bridge, to Chalk Beck, in the said County; and also the Road, which branches and separates from the same Road, upon Castle Sorwerby Pasture aforesaid, and leads from thence through Hefket, otherwise Hefket Newmarket, to Caldbeck, in the said County.

An Act for more effectually amending, widening, and keeping in Repair, the Roads leading from the Town of Northampton to Chain Bridge, near the Town of Market Harborough, and from the Direction Post in Kingshorpe, in the County of Northampton, to Wel-ford Bridge, in the said County; and for repealing several Acts made in the Eighth Year of King George the First, and the Twelfth and Twenty-third Years of His late Majesty, relating to the said Roads.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers of an Act passed in the Thirtieth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Second, for repairing and widening the Road from the North End of Dapdon Wharf, in the Parish of Steke, next Gudeford, through Gudeford to Andrew's Cross, and to Alfold Bars, in the County of Surrey; and from thence to St. Mary's Gate, in Arundel, in the County of Sussex.

## A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS divers Persons have been guilty of the illegal Practices of clandestine importing and running of prohibited and uncustomed Goods, and thereby subjected themselves to great Penalties, for which some have been already convicted, and are in Execution for the same, and others are under Prosecution, and many more liable to such Penalties, to avoid which they abscond, or are gone into Foreign Parts, which has, or may prove the Ruin of themselves and their Families; and whereas they may yet be of Use to Us and their Country in the present Conjuncture of Affairs, by serving Us in Our Navy or Army, in case they are rendered capable thereof, by Our gracious Pardon; We being desirous of giving them an Opportunity of entering into Our Service, and in Hopes of purging a Stop by this Means in a great Measure to Practices pernicious to the Publick Interest, and destructive to the Persons and Families of so many of Our Subjects, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby promise and declare, that in case any fit and able Person or Persons, who has or have incurred any Penalties in, by, or for the clandestine importing, running, landing, relanding, unshipping, concealing, or receiving, or being assisting in such running, landing, relanding, or unshipping any Prohibited Goods, Wares or Merchandizes, or any Goods liable to the Payment of the Duties of Customs or Excise or either of them, or who have been, abused, obstructed, or hindered any Officer or Officers of the Customs or Excise in the due Execution of their Duty, or who are under any Prosecution, Judgment, Outlawry, in Prison, or under or subject to any Execution for any of the said Offences, or gone beyond Sea to avoid the same, shall, on or before the First Day of August next, in case they are Seamen, voluntarily enter themselves as Sailors in Our Service, either with the Officers of Our Ships or Vessels of Our Royal Navy, or other Officers of Our Navy empowered to enter Men to serve on Board Our said Ships or Vessels, or, in case they are not Seamen, enlist themselves as Volunteers in Our Service as Soldiers or Marines; or who, being themselves unfit to serve in such Capacities as aforesaid, from the Infirmities of Age, Sickness, or other Cause, shall procure Two such fit and able Men as shall be approved by such Officer or Officers in Our Land or Sea Service respectively, as shall be empowered to receive the same; all and every such Person and Persons so serving, or providing Two fit and able Substitutes to serve for him, her, or them as aforesaid, shall have Our gracious Pardon of and for all and every such Offence and Offences and Penalties, and all Indictments, Informations, Prosecutions, Con-
