Practices of claudestine importing and running of prohibited and uncustomed Goods, and thereby subjected themselves to great Penalties, for which some have been already convicted, and a e in Execution for the fame, and others a e under P necution, and many more liable to such renalues, ... renalties, to avoid which they abscond, or are gone into Foreig Parts, which has, or may prove the Ruin of them elves and their families; and hereas into Foreig he, ay yet be of Use to Us and their Country in the pres nt Conjuncture of Affice, by se ving Us in On Navy or Army, in case they are rendered capable the eot, by Our gracious Pardon; We being delirous of giving them an Opportunity of entering into Our bervice, and in Hopes of puring a Stop by this Meas s in a great Measure to Practices pernicious to the Publick Interest, and destructive of the Persons and ramilies of fo many of Our Subjects, have thought fic. by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation; and We do hereby promise and declare, that in case any fit and able Person or Persons, who has or have incurred any Penalties in, by, or for the clandestine importing, running, landing, relanding, unthipping, concealing, or receiving, or being affifting in fuch running, landing, relanding, or unshipping any Prohibited Goods, Wares or Merchandizes, or any Goods liable to the Payment of the Duties of Customs or Excise or either of them, or who have beat, abused, obstructed, or hindered any Officer or Officers of the Customs or Excise in the due Execution of their Duty, or who are under any Profecution, Judgment, Outlawry, in Prison, or under or subject to any Execution for any of the faid Offences, or gone beyond Sea to avoid the same, shall, on or before the First Day of August next, in case they are Seamen, voluntarily enter themselves as Sailors in Our Service, either with the Officers of Our Ships or Vessels of Our Royal Navy, or other Officers of Our Navy empowered to enter Men to serve on Board Our said Ships or Vessels, or, in case they are not Seamen, inlift themfelves as Volunteers in Our Service as Soldiers or Marines; or wio, being themselves unfit to serve in such Capacities as aforesaid, from the Infirmities of Age, Sickness, or other Cause, shall procure Two fuch fit and able Men as shall be approved by such Officer or Officers in Our Land or Sea Service respectively, as shall be impowered to receive the fame; all and every fuch Person and Persons so serving, or providing Two sit and able Substitutes to serve for him, her, or them as aforesaid, shall have Our gracious Pardon of and for all and every such Offence and Offences and Penalies, and all Indictments, Informations, Profecutions, Convictions,
