General Post-Office, April 7, 1778.

ON Saturday last the 4th Instant, about Eleven at Night, the Post Boy was attacked and robbid, Eight Miles from York, in the Road to Malicn, of the Bag of Letters from this Office of Thursday Night last the 2d Instant, for Scarborough, Malion, Whithy, and other Places within the Delivery of Scarborough and Malton, and also of the Bag with the Bye and Roaa Letters for the same Places.

The Person who committed this Robbery was then on Foot, but when he paffed two Turnpike Gates in the Neighbourhood was mounted upon a Light Bay mettled Horje, about Fourteen Hands and an Half high, strong made; and the Bar keepers agree with the Post-Boy in the Description of the Robber, that he was a Stout M.n. Six Feet high, and thin in the Face, Black Stockings, Waistcoat and Breeches, and Brown Copper-coloured Cout; bis own short curled Hair powdered, with a round Hat, two Sides of it tied up; and the Post-Boy observed, whilst he lay with his Hands and Feet bound in a Field adjoining the Road, that the Robber put the Bills, &c. which he took out of the Letters, into the infide Pocket of his light Great
