St. James's, June 6. HURSDAY last being the Anniver-lary of His Majelty's Birth-Day, the fame was observed at Court, where there was a very numerous and splendid Ap-pearance of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Perfons of Diffinction, to compliment His Majefty on the Occasion. At One o'Clock the Majesty on the Occasion. Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired; and in the Evening there was a Ball at Court; and Illuminations, and other Publick Demonstrations of Joy, throughout London and Westminster.

Westminster, June 3.

• HIS Day His Majetty came to the Houle of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Knight, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleafed to give the Royal Affent to

An Act for granting to His Majefty a certain Sum of Money, out of the Sinking Fund; and for applying cer-tain Monies; therein mentioned, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-eight; and for farther appropriating the Supplies granted in this Seffion of Parliament; and for carrying to the Aggregate Fund a Sum of Money which hath arifen by the Two Sevenths Excise.

An ASt for fettling and fecuring a certain Annuity on the Earl of Chatham, and the Heirs of the Body of the late William Pitt, Earl of Chatham, to whom the Earldom of Chatham fhall defcend, in Confideration of the eminent Services performed by the faid late Earl to His Majefty, and the Public.

After which His Majesty was pleased to make the following most Gracious Speech :

My Lords, and Gentlemen, FTER fo long and laborious an Application A to the Publick Bufinefs, 1 think it proper at this Seafon of the Year to give you fome Receis.

the Honour of My Crown, and for your Attention-to the real Interests of all My Subjects, in the wife, just, and humane Laws, which have been the Refult of your Deliberations, and which, I hope, will be attended with the most falutary Effects in every Part of the British Empire.

My Defire to preferve the Tranquillity of Europe has been uniform and fincere : I reflect with great Satisfaction that I have made the Faith of Treaties and the Law of Nations the Rule of My Conduct, and that it has been My constant Care to give no just Cause of Offence to any Foreign Power; let that Power, by whom this Tranquillity shall be dif-turbed, answer to their Subjects and to the World for all the stal Confequences of War.

The Vigour and Firmnels of My Parliament have enabled Me to be prepared for fuch Events and Emergencies as may happen; and I truft that the experienced Valour and Difcipline of My Fleets and Armies, and the loyal and united Ardour of the Nation, armed and animated in the Defence of every Thing that is dear to them, will be able, under the Protection of Divine Providence, to defeat all the Enterprizes which the Enemies of My Crown may prefume to undertake, and convince them how dangerous it is to provoke the Spirit and Strength of Great Britain.

Gentlemen of the House of Commons,

I thank you for the Chearfulness with which you have granted the large and ample Supplies for the Service of the current Year, and for your Care in raifing them in a Manner the most effectual and the least burthensome; and My warmest Acknowledgements are due to you for the Provision you have enabled Me to make for the more honourable Support of My Family.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

Your Prefence in your respective Countries may at this Time be of great publick Advantage. The Sovereign and Knights Companions being feated, Black Rod acquainted His Majetty, that Thomas Browne, Elq; Garter Principal King of Arms, attended at the Door, and humbly prayed to be admitted to take the Oath of Office as Chief Officer of Arms of that Most Noble Order, and Garter being introduced in his Mantle by Black .Rod, and kneeling down near the Sovereign, the Oath was administered to him by the Chancellor; after which His Majesty was pleased to put the Gold Chain and Badge of Garter's Office about his Neck ; and having killed His 'Majeity's Hand, he with-drew; and, by Permillion of the Sovereign, John Martin Leake, Elq; Chefter Herald, put on Garter's Mantle, and officiated for Garter during the rest of the Ceremony

The Chancellor then acquainted His Majefty, that the Dean of Windfor, Dr. John Harley, attended at the Door, and humbly prayed Admittance to take the Oath as Register of that Most Noble Order ; whereupon being introduced in his Mantle by Deputy Garter and Black Rod, he was fworn and invested with the Enfigns of the Register's Office in like Manner, and withdrew to his Place.

The Chancellor then fignified to the Chapter the Sovereign's Pleafure for filling up the Three vacant Stalls.

The Knights Companions then proceeded to Election ; and the Suffrages being collected by the Chancellor, and prefented to the Sovereign, the Earl of Suffolk and Berkshire was declared duly elected.

Deputy Garter and Black Rod were then fent to introduce the Earl of Rochford, who, being knighted by His Majelty with the Sword of State, withdrew.

The Chapter then proceeded to Election, and the Earl of Rochford was declared duly elected. His Lordship was thereupon received at the Door of the Chapter Room by the two Junior Knights, and conducted between them to the Sovereign, being preceded by Deputy Garter hearing the Enfigus on

a Cufhion, and Black Rod. Deputy Garter prefenting the Garter to the So-vereign, His Majefty delivered it to the two Senior Knights, who buckled it upon his Lordship's Left

Leg, the Chancellor reading the Admonition. Deputy Garter then presented the Ribbon with the George, and his Lordfhip kneeling down, the Sovereign, with the Affiftance of the Two Knights, put it over his Shoulder, the Chancellor in the mean Time pronouncing the Admonition; and having kiffed His Majefty's Hand, and feverally faluted all the Knights prefeat, he withdrew.

The Lord Viscount Weymouth was then introduced and knighted ; and the Chapter proceeding to the other Election, his Lordship was declared duly elected, and was invested with the Garter, Ribbon, and George, in the fame Manner as the Earl of Rochford had been.

Deputy Garter then calling over the Knights, a Procession was made back to His Majesty's Closet in the fame Manner it came from thence.

Queen's Palace, Wednifday Evening, June 3. The Earl of Suffolk and Berkshire, who was do-clared duly elected by the Chapter of the Most Noble Order of the Garter held this Day at St. James's, for filling up the Three vacant Stalls, being indifposed, the King was graciously pleased to dispense with his Lordship's Prefence at the faid Chapter, and to order him to attend here this Evening; when His Majesly, affisted by Their Royal-Highnesses the Prince of Wales and Prince Frederick, inveited his Lordship with the Garter, Ribbon, and George.

Admiralty-Office, June 2, 1778. VICE-Admiral Lord Howe, in his Letter to Mr. Stankara Mr. Stephens, Secretary of the Admiralty, dated the z3d of April, gives an Account, That the Rebels had attempted, towards the End of the preceding Month, to put to Sea from Providence, in the Armed Ship Columbus, of 16 Guns; but not chufing their Time with Judgment, fhe was driven on Shore by the Maidflone off of Point Judith, and burnt by the Boats of the Squadron.
