Tuesday, June 16, 1778.

ON Tuesday last, the 9th Instant, the Body of the late Honourable William Pitt, Earl of Chatham, was publickly interred, in a Vault prepared for the Purpose, in the North Transept of the Collegiate Church of Westminster.

Early in the Morning, all the Avenues leading from Westminster-Hall, and the private Doors into the Court of Requests, were secured to prevent Confusion; and between Ten and Eleven o'Clock the Peers, Peers Sons, Chief Mourner, his Supporters, Eight Peers Assitant, and Relations of the Deceased, began to assemble in the House of Lords, the Members of the House of Commons in their own House, and the Clergy and Gentry in the Committee-Rooms adjoining, pursuant to Notices in the Gazette and other Evening Papers, and Directions on the Tickets delivered at the College of Arms.

About One o'Clock the Officers of Arms began to marshal the Nobility, Clergy and Gentry, in the Painted Chamber, where the Body had lain in State Sunday and Monday preceding; the Conductors and Poor Men in the Court of Requests; and the Procession was made through Westminster-Hall, New Palace-yard, Part of Parliament-street, Bridge-street, King-street, the Broad Sanctuary, and in at the West Door of Westminster-Abbey. The Line of Procession, from the Gate of Westminster-Hall to the Door of the Abbey, was railed on both Sides; a Detachment of Foot Guards, under the Command Major-General Style, within the Railing, and all the Constables of Westminster attended.

The Procession closed by Servants of the Family, in close Mourning.

The Six Conductors and Seventy Poor Men were divided and ranged on each Side without the Church Door, and the rest of the Procession within the Church.

At the Entrance of Westminster Abbey (within the Door) the Dean and Prebendaries, with the Choir, fell into the Procession immediately after the Great Banner and before the Herald's who bore the Trophies.

The Chief Mourner and his Two Supporters were seated on Chairs at the Head of the Body; Stools were placed on the Sides of the Grave for the Eight Assistant Mourners, and One at each End for the Four Supporters of the Pall.

During the Service in the Church, the Coronet and Cushion were placed on the Body, and the Canopy and Bannerolls held over it: The Trophies were laid on a Table placed behind the Chief Mourner's Chair, covered with a Black Silk Carpet fringed.

The Service over, Clarenceux Deputy to Garter proclaimed the Style, and the Earls Three Officers breaking their Staves gave the Pieces to Garter, who threw them into the Grave.

The Standard, Banners, Bannerolls, and Trophies, having been deposited in the Church, the Procession returned to the Painted Chamber in the same Order.
