Nottinghamshire Militia.

Whereas, by an Act of Parliament made in the fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "an Act to explain, amend, and reduce into one Act of Parliament, the several Laws now in being relating to the raising and training of the Militia within that Part of Great-Britain called England," it is enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty's Lieutenant of every County, Riding, and Place, where the Militia has been or shall be raised, together with any two or more Deputy Lieutenants, and, on the Death or Removal, or in the Absence, of His Majesty's Lieutenants, any three or more Deputy Lieutenants, whenever and as often as they shall find necessary, to summon or cause to be summoned a General Meeting, according to the Directions of the Act passed in the second Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for summoning General Meetings in Counties where the Militia has not been raised, which General Meetings had been held on the last Tuesday in May, or on the last Tuesday in October in each Year, in Pursuance of the said Act:

And whereas the Time for which the Men now serving in the Militia will expire in the Months of August, September, and October next: Notice is hereby given, that a General Meeting will be held at the Swan Inn in Mansfield, on Wednesday the Twenty-ninth Day of this present Month, at Eleven o'Clock in the Morning, in order to put the Militia into Execution; at which Time and Place the Deputy Lieutenants of the said County are requested to attend.
