Edinburgh, September 24.

THIS Day came on, at the Palace of Holyrood House, in consequence of His Majesty's Proclamation, the Election of a Peer of Scotland, to sit and vote in the present Parliament of Great Britain, in the Room of Charles Lord Viscount Irvine deceased. William John Marquess of Lothian was elected unanimously. The Peers were attended by Alexander Tait and Alexander Robertson, Esquires, two of the principal Clerks of Session, in virtue of a Commission from the Lord Register of Scotland, as Clerks to the Election; and by two of His Majesty's Chaplains, the Reverend Doctors Robertson and Webster; and other proper Officers.

The Peers present, were, the Earls of Eglinton, Caillies, Home, Abercorn, Lauderdale, Loudoun, Dumfries, Dalhousie, Aberdeen, Hyndford, Roseberry; the Lord Viscount Stormont; the Lords Elphinston, Somerville, Colvil.

There were Proxies from the Earls of Galloway and Kintore to the Earl of Dalhousie.

And there were signed Lifts from the Dukes of Gordon and Athol; the Marquess of Lothian; the Earls of Caithness, Kelly, Leven, Northesk, Aboyne, Breadalbain, March and Rüglen, Portmore, Hope-ton; the Lord Viscount Dumblain; the Lords Forbes and Bamff.

Dublin, September 24.

Tuesday last, being the Anniversary of Their Majesties Coronation, in the Morning the Flag was hoisted on Bedford Tower; at Noon the great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks; and in the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Joy.
