

Turin, September 16. Yesterday their Sardinian Majesties left the Vigne de la Reine, and are gone to their Country Palace at Montcalier, attended by all the Royal Family, except their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Piedmont, and the Duke and Dutchess of Chablais, who intend staying a few Days at Stipinaggi, as there are still some small Remains of the Small Pox at Montcalier.

St. James's, October 1, 1778.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, in the Night of Saturday the 18th of July last, Robert Jennings, one of the Crew of the Assistance Cutter, in the Service of the Customs at Dover, who has a Deputation from the Commissioners of the said Revenue, empowering him to seize Prohibited and Uncustomed Goods, being in the due Execution of his Duty, within the Limits of the said Port, with Seven Men in the Boat belonging to the said Cutter, in order to look after the Smugglers, fell in with a Boat loaded with a great Number of Casks of Spirituous Liquors, which the Officers chased till the Goods were run on Shore, and then made Seizure thereof, and also of the Boat;

That thereupon the Smugglers, who were assembled on the Beach, began to resist the Officers in the Performance of their Duty, by obstructing them therein, and firing upon them, and actually shot one of the said Officers dead upon the Spot;

That the Coroner's Inquest have set on the Body, and brought in their Verdict Wilful Murder by Persons unknown;

His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one or more of the Offenders, who shall discover his or their Accomplices, (except the Person who actually killed the Officer) so that they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

#### SUFFOLK.

And, as a farther Encouragement, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs do hereby promise a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to the Persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any one or more of his or their Accomplices, (excepting the Person who actually fired upon and killed the Officer as aforesaid) to be paid by the Receiver General and Cashier of the Customs upon Conviction.
