Naples, September 15.

**T**HE Accounts of the Plague in the Levant are still very alarming; the Guards have been doubled on the Coasts of this Kingdom; and many other Precautions are talked of, to prevent it's coming into these Kingdoms. All Vessels from the following Places are absolutely forbid to enter any of the Ports of his Sicilian Majesty's Dominions, viz. from the Ottoman Levant, from the Venetian Levant and it's Islands, from Castelnovo, Budua, Cattaro, Curzola, Ragusa, Dalmatia and it's Neighbourhood, and from the Venetian Itria.

At Radicofani in Tuscany several Shocks of an Earthquake have been lately felt, and there is at this present Time a very considerable Eruption of Lava from Mount Vesuvius, which has already destroyed some Vineyards, and threatens many more.

Vienna, September 30. The Grand Duke of Tuscany arrived here from the Camp three Days ago, and the Archduke Maximilian is expected tomorrow.

The Imperial Family returns to Town this Day for the Winter.

Vienna, September 30. On the 19th Marshal Laudohn's Head Quarters were removed from Weldrus to Strachkowi. The Enemy have passed the Elbe near Leitmeritz. General de Vins, at the Head of the Battalions of Brood and Gradiſe, and of six Divisions of Cavalry, advanced on the 19th towards Leitmeritz; and not only dislodged the Enemy from that Town, but obliged them likewise to abandon their Entrenchments there. Our Troops have had almost daily Skirmishes with the Enemy, who have been forced to retire towards the Frontiers of Saxony, having accordingly made, on the 23d, the necessary Dispositions for that Purpose, Lieutenant-General Moellendorff's Corps, which was posted near the Heights of Haenberg, and Prince Henry of Prussia's Army, which was encamped in the Neighbourhood of Lovofitz, retreated early on the 24th towards Toeplitz.

Vienna, October 3. The Archduke Maximilian arrived Yesterday in this Capital, to the great Joy of the Imperial Family, as his Royal Highness's Health is in a fair Way of being compleatly re-established.

Hague, October 6. Their Serene and Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Orange returned Yesterday in perfect Health from Soestdyk to this City, for the Winter Season.
