Petersburg, October 6.

**T**HURSDAY, being the Birth-Day of His Imperial Highness the Great Duke, there was a numerous Appearance of Nobility and Gentry to congratulate His Imperial Highness in the Morning, and in the Evening there was a splendid Ball at Court; and Saturday, being the Anniversary of the Empress's Coronation, her Imperial Majesty was complimented in the Morning, and the Day concluded with a Ball. On this Occasion Mons. Michaelson was raised to the Rank of Major-General, and invested with the Order of St. Alexander. The Countess Romanzow, Mother to the Marshal, was appointed Grande Gouvernante. Several Ribbons of St. Ann were given away, and Four new Gentilhommes de la Chambre were made.

Vienna, October 14. On the 9th Instant the Austrian Army in Moravia, under the Command of General Elrichhausen, marched towards the Frontier of Austrian Silesia, in order to dislodge from Troppau, and its Neighbourhood, the Corps of Prussians, of which Prince Frederick of Brunswick is said to be Commander.

Vienna, October 17. The Prussian Lieutenant-General de Wunsch remains still in his Camp behind Ruckers. The Army under the King of Prussia has not yet entirely quitted their Camp behind Schatzlar; by the last Accounts only a Part had gone into Silesia; but the greatest Part of the Artillery has been transported thither.

St. James's, October 27.

The King has been pleased to grant the Dignity of a Baronet of the Kingdom of Great Britain unto Sir Robert Gunning, of Eltham in the County of Kent, Knight of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, and to his Issue.

St. James's, October 31.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Lord Viscount Stormont to be His Majesty's Justice General in that Part of His Majesty's Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, in the Room of Charles Duke of Queensberry, deceased.

Dublin, October 24, 1778.

Yesterday, being the Anniversary of the Irish Rebellion in 1641, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower; at Noon the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks; and the Evening concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
