By the KING, A PROCLAMATION, For a General Fast.

GEORGE R.

E, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the just and necessary Hostilities in which We are engaged with the French King, and the unnatural Rebellion carrying on in fome of Our Provinces and Colonies in North America, and putting Our Truft in Almighty God, America, and putting Our Fruit in Atinigity God, that He will vouchfafe a fpecial Bleffing on Our Arms both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby Command, That a Public Faft and Humilia-tion be observed throughout that Part of Great Britain called England, Our Dominion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, upon Wed-order the Testh Day of February next: that fo nefday the Tenth Day of February next; that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins; and may, in the most devout and folemn Manner, fend up Our Prayers and Suppli-cations to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deferved; and im-ploring His Bleffing and Athitance on Our Arms; and for refloring and perpetuating Peace, Safety, and Prosperity, to Us and Our Kingdoms: And We do strictly Charge and Command, That the faid Public Fait be reverently and devoutly observed by all Our loving Subjects in England, Our Domi-nion of Wales, and Town of Berwick upon Tweed, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation; and upon Pain of fuch Punifhment as We may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and necessary a Duty.-And, for the better and more orderly folemnizing the fame, We have given Directions to the Molt Reverend the Archbilhops, and the Right Reverend the Bifhops of England, to compole a Form of Prayer fuitable to this Occasion, to be used in all Churches, Chapels, and Places of Public Worthip; and to take Care the fame be timely difperfed throughout their respective Dioceses. the unnatural Rebellion carrying on in fome of Our Provinces and Colonies in North America, and putting Our Trust in Almighty God, that he will vouchfafe a special Bleffing on Our Arms both by Sea and Land, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, hereby Command, That a Publick Fait and Humiliation be ob-ferved throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, on Tuesday the Ninth Day of February next, that fo both We and Our People may humble Ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon of Our Sins ; and may, in the most devout and folem Manner, fend up Our. Prayers and Supplications to the Divine Majesty, for averting those heavy Judgments which Our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly deferved, and imploring His Bleffing and Affiftance of Our Arms, and for reftoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety and Profperity to Us and Our King-doms: And We do firitfly Charge and Command, That the faid Publick Faft be reverently and de-voutly obferved by all Our loving Subjects in Scot-land, as they tender the Favour of Almishum Col land, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inflict on all such as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo religious and neceffary a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and We Charge, that incontinent this Our Proclamation feen, ye pals to the Market Crois of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance. And Our Will and Pleafure is, That Our Sollicitor do caule Printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewarties, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published; and We appoint them to fend Doubles hereof to the feveral Paroch Kirks within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service. Given at Our Court at St. James's, the First Day of January, One thousand feven hundred and feventy-nine, in the Nineteenth Year of Our Reign.

GOD Save the KING.

AT the Court at St. James's, the 14th of December, 1778,

P R E S E N T, The KING's Moff Excellent Majefty in Council. W Hereas His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, hy His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of October 1776, to promife and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, 'fhould be paid in the Manner'thereby directed, to every fuch" Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Pifty,
