St. James's, February 2, 1779.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, about Six o'Clock in the Morning of the 2d of last Month, a dreadful Fire broke out in the Royal Hospital for Seamen at Greenwich, which extended itself with such Rapidity and raged with such Violence, that, before the same could be extinguished, the Chapel and Cupola, with several of the Wards in Queen Mary's Building, were destroyed, and other considerable Damage done; and whereas it has been further represented to His Majesty, that, notwithstanding the most diligent Enquiries, it hath not yet appeared whether the said Fire was the Effect of Accident, or wilfully and maliciously occasioned by some Evil-disposed Person or Persons at present unknown: His Majesty, therefore, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice any Person or Persons who may have been concerned in wilfully and maliciously setting Fire to the said Hospital, as above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious
