Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King,
 that, about Six o'Clock in the Morning of the 2d
 of last Month, a dreadful Fire broke out in the Royal
 Hospital for Seamen at Greenwich, which extended
 itself with such Rapidity and roged with such Violence,
 that, before the same could be extinguished, the Chapel
 and Cupola, with several of the Waras in Queen Mary's
 Building, were destroyed, and other considerable Da-
 mage done; and whereas it has been further represented
 to His Majesty, that, notwithstanding the most diligent
 Enquiries, it hath not yet appeared whether the said
 Fire was the Effect of Accident, or wilfully and mali-
 ciously occasioned by some Evil-disposed Person or Per-
 sons, at present unknown: His Majesty, therefore, for
 the better discovering and bringing to Justice any Per-
 son or Persons who may have been concerned in wilfully
 and maliciously setting Fire to the said Hospital, as
 above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most
 gracious Pardon to any One of the said Offenders (ex-
 cept the Person or Persons who actually set Fire to the
 said Hospital) who shall discover his or her Accomplice
 or Accomplices in the said Offence, so that he, she, or
 they, may be apprehended and duly convicted thereof.

 concerned in the above mentioned atrocious Offence, the
 Commissioners and Governors of the said Hospital do

hereby promise a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED

 Offenders, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended
 and convicted as aforesaid.

Navy Office, February 3, 1779.

Whereas a Person was observed on Saturday the 23d
 of last Month, about Twelve o'Clock at Night,
 to ascend the Wall of His Majesty's Dock-yard at Ply-
 mouth, and to throw himself over the said Wall; and
 upon examining the Spit on the Outside of the Wall,
 there was found a Rattling-line tied in Knots about 16
 or 18 Inches asunder, with a large Newfoundland
 Fish-bone at the End of it, by which he got up, and
 a Twine Thread, with a Stone tied to it, which
 reached from the top of the Wall to the Bottom; and
 near the Spot was also found a Bottle filled with Gun-
 powder, stopped with brown Paper, prepared to burn
 as a Quick Match: The Principal Officers and Com-
 missioners of His Majesty's Navy do hereby give Notice,
 that whoever will apprehend the said Person, and
 bring him before any Magistrate, or give such Notice
 as may be the Means of his being apprehended, so that
 he be produced to the Commissioners of His Majesty's
 Navy at Plymouth Dock-yard, or the Commissioners of
 the Navy in London, shall receive Three Hundred
 Pounds Reward on his Conviction, to be paid by the
 said Commissioners of the Navy.

N. B. He appeared to be a short elderly Man, wore
 his own Hair, had on a dark Surtout Coat looked like
 a Foreigner, with a swarvelled Face, and wore a fan-
 tail Hat.

ON Saturday last the 16th Instant, about Six o'Clock
 in the Evening, the Post-Boy was attacked and
 robbed, at a Place called Priest's Bridge, about Four
 Miles North of Morpeth, of the whole Scotch Mail,
 and the Bags from Berwick, Belford, and Alnwick,
 which should have arrived here this Morning, by Two
 Footpads, armed with Bludgeons, who stopped the
 Boy, cut the Mails from the Cart, and immediately
 conveyed the same into a Wood adjoining, of whom no
 further Description can be given from the Darkness of
 the Night.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to
 be apprehended and convicted, both or either of the
 Persons who committed this Robbery, will be intitled
 to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS,
 over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliam-
 ent for apprehending Highwaymen: Or if any Per-
 son, whether an Accomplice in the said Robbery, or
 knowing thereof, shall make Discovery, whereby both
 or either of the Persons who committed the same may
 be apprehended and brought to Justice; such Discoverer
 will, upon Conviction of both or either of the Parties,
 be intitled to the same Reward of TWO HUNDRED
 POUNDS
