On Friday last General Dresden, February 14. Mollendorf was invested with the Order of the Black

Eagle by Prince Henry of Prussia.

All the Movements in this Army are now at an End. The whole View was the Expedition against Brix, which was executed by General Mollendorf; but the Success was not so compleat as was expected, General Teuffel having been stopt in his Passage into Bohemia by the Quantity of Snow that had fallen, by which Means their Han of surprizing three Austrian Regiments did not succeed. However, they are all returned into Saxony with the Loss only of a Major and four Standards of the Regiment of Wunsch, that were taken at an Outpost by a small Party of Croats. The Ad vantages the Prussians have gained on this Expedition are 350 Men, and a tew Officers, Prisoners, .two Pieces of Cannon, and burning the Magazine at Brix. General Mollendorf is returned to his Command at Freyberg, and for the present every Thing is quiet on the Frontiers.
