THIS Evening the Ceremony of the Christening of the Young Prince was performed in the Great Council-Chamber by his Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury. His Royal Highness was named Octavius.

The Sponsors were, his Serene Highness the Duke of Brunwick, represented by the Earl of Hertford, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household; his Serene Highness the Duke of Mecklenburgh Swerin, represented by the Earl of Athburnham, Groom of the Stole; and her Serene Highness the Dutchess of Saxe-Weimar, represented by the Countess of Egremont, Lady of Her Majesty's Bed-Chamber.
