THE King has been pleased to fill up the Thirteen vacant Stalls of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, by conferring the Honour of Knighthood of that Order on Sir James Adolphus Oughton; Sir Robert Gunning, Bart. Sir George Howard: the Right Honourable Sir John Blaquiere; Sir William Gordon; the Right Honourable Sir John Irwine; Sir Guy Carleton; Honourable Sir William Howe; Sir Henry Clinton; Sir Edward Hughes; Sir James Harris; Sir Hector Munro; and the Earl of Antrim. And His Majesty has been pleased to appoint the Installation of the said Knights of the Bath to be on Wednesday the Nineteenth Day of this present Month of May.

The King has been pleased to order a Congé d'Elire to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Lincoln, for electing a Bishop of that See, the same being now void by the Death of the Right Reverend Father in God, John late Bishop thereof; and also a Letter recommending to the said Dean and Chapter Thomas Thurlow, Doctor in Divinity, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in this present Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for repealing an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for the more easy and better Recruiting of His Majesty's Land Forces and Marines; and for substituting other and more effectual Provisions in the Place thereof;" It is, among other Things, enacted, That it shall be lawful for His Majesty to suspend or revive the Execution of the said Act, with respect to the Whole of Great Britain, or any Part thereof, by Proclamation or Order in Council, or other publick Notice in the London Gazette: And whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty, that great Inconveniencies may arise from executing the said Act in the Country at large, during the Time of Hay and Corn Harvest; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That from and after the Twenty-second Day of this Instant May, the further Execution of the said Act for repealing an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, intituled, "An Act for the more easy and better Recruiting of His Majesty's Land Forces and Marines, and for substituting other and more effectual Provisions in the Place thereof;" shall be suspended (until

further Notice) throughout every County and Place in South Britain, except the Cities, Towns and Places undermentioned, where the same Inconveniencies are not likely to occur, and where the Act may continue to be executed with Benefit to His Majesty's Service, viz.

The City of London, the City and Liberties of Westminster, and such Part of the County of Middlesex, as lies within the Bills of Mortality.
