The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act paffed in this prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled, "An Act "for repeating an Act made in the last Seffion of * Parliament, intituled, An A& for the more eafy * and better Recruiting of His Majefty's Land " Forces and Marines ; and for subfiltuting other " and more effectual Provisions in the Place there-" of ;" It is, among other Things, enacted, That it thall be lawful for His Majefty to fufpend or re-vive the Execution of the faid Act, with refpect to the Whole of Great Britain, or any Part thereof, by Proclamation or Order in Council, or other publick Notice in the London Gazette : And whereas it hath been represented to His Majelly; that great Inconveniencies may arife from executing the faid Act in the Country at large, during the Time of Hay and Corn Harveft; His Majefty doth there-fore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, That from and after the Twenty-fecond Day of this Inflant May, the further Execution of the faid Act for repealing an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, initialed, "An "Act for the more easy and better Recruiting of " His Majesty's Land Forces and Marines, and for " fubfituring other and more effectual Provifions in the Place thereof;" fhall be fulpended (until
