**T**HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by Sir Francis Molyneux, Knight, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that the Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great-Britain, the Lord President of the Council, and several other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

*An Act for the further Relief of Protestant Dissenting Ministers and School-masters.*

*An Act to repeal so much of several Acts of Parliament as prohibit the Growth and Produce of Tobacco in Ireland, and to permit the Importation of Tobacco of the Growth and Produce of that Kingdom into Great Britain, under the like Duties and Regulations as Tobacco of the Growth of the British Colonies in America is permitted to be imported.*

*An Act for granting a Bounty upon the Importation into this Kingdom of Hemp, of the Growth of the Kingdom of Ireland, for a limited Time.*

*An Act for granting a Drawback of the Duties imposed by an Act of the last Session of Parliament upon all Foreign Wines exported from Great Britain to any British Colony or Plantation in America, or to any British Settlement in the East Indies.*

*An Act to enable the Chancellor and Council of the Duchy of Lancaster to sell and dispose of certain Free Farm Rents, and other Rents, and to enfranchise Copyhold and Customary Tenements within their Survey, and to encourage the Growth of Timber on Lands held of the said Duchy.*

*An Act for better securing the Duties on Stavech.*

Dresden, May 5. The Whole of the Prussian Army in this Electorate has taken every Step preparatory to their Marching, but hitherto neither of the Columns have begun to move.

Vienna, May 6. The Emperor has been pleased to appoint Lieutenant-General Count Joseph Coloredo to the Command of the whole Artillery of this Monarchy, with the same Powers which were enjoyed by Prince Kinsky, but without the Title of Grand Maitre.

The Command of the Troops in Italy, vacant by the Death of Marshal Wied, has been bestowed upon General Count Xaverius Harrach. The Regiment of Deuxponts, Dragoons, has been given to the Second Prince of Waldeck; the Regiment will however retain its former Name.

Copenhagen, May 8. A Placart has been published, dated April 19, prescribing certain Premiums and Regulations for the sending and importation of Provisions and other Merchandize to and from the Danish West-India Islands, with other Points relative to the West-India Trade.
