all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weilminfler, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoign, &c. fhall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize, and fecure in fome of His Majefty's Warehouses, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board any Vefiel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he shall; for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain fhall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office

under His Majesty. One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Ma-jefty's Order in Council of the set! jesty's Order in Council of the 17th of February last, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire on the 23d of this inftant May: And whereas it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, except in those Cafes where (for the Benefit and Advantage of Trade, and for the Ufe and Defence of Ships trading to Foreign Parts, and of the Transports and Victualling Veffels employed in His Majesty's Service) His Majesty, by His feveral Orders in Council of the 13th and 27th of October, and of the 6th and 22d of November, 1775, of the 5th and 19th of February, and the 23d of August and 25th of September, 1776, of the 16th of April, the 13th of August, and the 3d and 10th of October, 1777, of the 19th of June, the 7th and 26th of August, and the 10th of September last, has thought proper to permit and allow the Exportation of, and carrying Coaffwife, Gunpow-der, Saltpetre, Arms and Ammunition, under certain Conditions and Restrictions mentioned in the faid Orders : His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that

no Perfon or Perfons wholoever (except the Master-General, Lieutenant-General, or Principal Officers of the Ordnance, for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Three Months, to commence from the faid 23d Day of this inftant May, prefume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coattwife, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Am-munition, on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same beyond the Seas, or carrying the fame Coastwife, except in the Cafes comprized within the aforementioned Orders in Council, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and suffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the 29th Year of His late Majetty's Reign, entituled, " An Act This late imagency's Keign, entituted, "An Act "to impower His Majefly to prohibit the Ex-"portation of Saltpetre, and to enforce the Law "for empowering His Majefly to prohibit the "Exportation of Gunpowder, or any Sort of "Arms and Ammunition; and alfo to impower "His Majefly to reftrain the carrying Coaffwife "of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms " of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition." — And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majetty's Treasury, the Commif-fioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

The King has been pleafed to grant unto Peter Ferguson, Meschant, refiding at Warsaw in the Kingdom of Poland, and to his Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to affume and use the Surname and Arm of Tepper, conjointly with the Surname and Arms of Ferguíon, (fuch Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in His Majefty's Heralds Office ;) and also to order, that this His Majesty's Conceffion and Declaration be registered in the Heralds Office.

Dublin, June 5.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of His Majesty's Birth Day, the Flag was difplayed on Bedford Tower, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phœnix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regi-ments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. At Noon there was a very numerous Affembly of the Nobility and other Perfons of Diffinction, of both Sexes, at the Caffle, who appeared in extraordinary Splendor to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant, before whom an Ode, (let to Mufick) was performed. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency to the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires and other Demonstrations of Joy.
