IN a Lew received from Captain Henry, the Senior Officer of the King's Ships at Georgia, just before I left New-York, dated 16th April, from Savannah, he mentions Two Rebel Galleys, called the Congress and Lee, (the former carrying r Eighteen Pouroer, and r Twelve in her Prow, 2 Nine Pounders and 2 Sixes in her Waste, and manned with 100 Men; the other with 130 French, carrying 1 Twelve and 1 Nine Pounder in her Provy, 2 Four and 2 One Pounders, besides Swivels, in her Waste) attacking the Greenwich armed Sloop, Comet, Thunder and Hornet Galleys off Yamasee Bluff, and that the Action had ended with the Capture of the Two Rebel Galleys. - Captain Henry writes, that the Officers and Men all behaved well, and that he was repairing the Galleys, which would be foon ready for Service, and that they were fit Vessels, if the Crown chose to purchase them: I have therefore directed an exact Valuation to be made; and as such Vessels are materially wanted there, I have, at the Request of Sir Henry Clinton, caused them to be purchased for His Majesty's Service; and commissioned the Congress, by the Name of the Scourge, and appointed Lieutenant George Prince from Half Pay, Lieutenant and Commander of her; and Mr. Edward Ellis Watmough to the Lee, called now the Vindictive.
