Admiralty-Office, October 2, 1779. Extract of a Letter from Captain George Montagu, Commander of His Majefly's Ship Pearl, to Mr. Stephens, dated at Spithead, September 28, 1779. N the 11th of September, being near the Weftern Islands, and in Want of Water, I put into Fayal, and having got on Board 26 Tons, failed the 13th.

On the 14th, at Six in the Morning, I gave Chace to a Ship in the N. W Quarter, and, at Half past Nine, brought her to Action, which continued until Half past Eleven, when she struck to His Mainfit Hal pait Eleven, when the truck to this Ma-jefty's Ship under my Command; Corvo diftant Six Leagues. She proved to be a Spanifh Frigate of 26 Twelve Pounders on her Main Deck, and 2 Four Pounders on her Forecaftle, with 271 Men, called the Santa Ammonica. The Pearl had 12 Men killed, and 19 wounded, (two of whom are fince dead). The Spanifh Frigate had 38 killed, and 45 wounded and 45 wounded.

I cannot fufficiently express my Approbation of the fpirited Bchaviour of the Officers and Ship's Company of the Fearl.

Extrast of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Sir Peter Parker, Commander in Chief of His Mijefly's Ships at Jamaica, to Mr. Stepheni, dated on Board the Ruby in Post Royal Harbour, July 26, 1779. Received September 29.

IS Majesty's Ship the Lion arrived here the 20th instant, almost a Wreck having suffered very confiderably in an Engagement, the 6th inflant, off Grenada, between the English and French Fleets. I think it but Justice to Captain Cornwallis to affure their Lordthips, that, from the distressed tuation of the Lion, the could not poffibly rejoin Vice-Admiral Byron: The gallant Behaviour of Captain Cornwallis during the Action, and the unwearied Pains taken by him afterwards to attack a Ship of equal Force, [this proved to be the Monmouth, of 64 Guns] supposed to be one of the French Squadron, are worthy of Commendation.
