The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council of the Order in Council of the 24th of September last, to direct, that no Person or Persons wholeever should, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to commence from the Date of the faid Order, prefume to transport out of this Kingdom, or carry Coaltwife, any Plates of Copper, or fhip or lade any Plates of Copper on Board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame beyond the Seas, of carry the fame Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majefly or His Privy Council. And whereas His Majelty or His Privy Council. And whereas His Majelty was pleafed, by another Order in Council, bearing Date the 7th of October, to permit and allow, under certain Provifoes and Con-ditions, the carrying of Copper Coaftwife from Port to Port, and allo the Exportation thereof to Foreign Parts, and all other Places to which the fame might have been lawfully exported at the Time of making the above-recited Order (except to any of of the Ports belonging to France or Spain). And whereas upon the humble Memorial of the Smelters and Manufacturers of Copper in Great Britain, the Provisoes and Conditions of the faid last-mentioned Order have been varied, and other Rules and Regulations have been established in Lieu thereof. And whereas the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the 24th of September, for prohibiting the Exportation or carrying of Copper Coattwife, will expire on the 24th of this inftant November, and it is judged expedient that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, fo as that the Exportation or carrying of Copper Coaffwife may continue to be reftrained, under the Rules and Regulations above-recited to have been established in that Behalf .- His Majesty is thereupon pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, that the faid Prohi-bition be continued for Three Months, to commence from the faid 24th Day of this infant November; but it is His Majesty's Pleasure that the same fhall not be taken to extend to any Sort of Copper, to be Exported or fent Coastwife for His Majesty's Service, by Order and under the Directions or Licence of the Commillioners of the Navy, nor to prevent the transporting or carrying Coastwife of any Sort of Copper (except Sheets of Copper of and under the Weight of Two and an Half Pounds to the Fost Superficial) without any Security being re-quired; nor to the exporting the fame to any Parts beyond the Sea, to which it may lawfully be ex-ported (except to any of the Ports belonging to France or Spain) upon Condition that all fuch Copper as is intended for Exportation shall be inspected and examined by an Agent or Agents, appointed or to be appointed by an right of right, of His Majefly's Navy, and that a Certificate, under the Hand and Seal of the faid Agent or Agents, thall be first had and obtained, fetting forth, that no Part of the fame confits of Plates of Copper, or Sheets of Copper (except as hereinafter excepted) or Nails made in whole or in Part of Copper, which can be made Use of for the Purpose of sheathing and coppering Ships or Veffels; which Certificate from the faid Agent shall be delivered to the proper Officers of the Cuftoms at the Port in which the faid
