The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. ALEREAS His Majefty was gracioully pleafed. Why dy His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 25th Day of October, 1476, to promile and declare, That the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman and of Two Bounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, who fhould, on or before the; 3 uft of December then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships, or the Chief Officers on Board fuch Tenders as fhould be employed for railing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also pleased, by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 8th Day of Noyember, 1776, torpromife and declare, That a Reward of Two Pounds for every Able, and Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed, to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might fecrete themfelves, that fo fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service, by any of His Majefty's Sea-Officers employed for railing Men; on or before the 31dt Day of De-cember, 1776: And whereas His Majefty was like-wife pleafed; by His Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the 15th Day of August 1777, to promife and declare, That every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should voluntarily enter him-felf to ferve on Board any of His Majesty's Ships, on or before the 31ft Day of October then next, should receive, as of His Majefly's Royal Bounty, the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, to be paid in Manner thereby directed : And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations, for Pay-ment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, hath been prolonged and extended to the 31ft Day of this inftant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Rewards should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majelty, with the Advice of His Privy-Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards be prolonged and extended from the faid 31ft Day of this in-fant December to the 31ft Day of March next, inclusive. —— Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accord-Steph.
